Introduction

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) formally recognizes that **Southern University at Shreveport** (hereinafter referred to as **SUSLA**) and **Grambling State University** (hereinafter referred to as **GSU**), desire to promote mutual interest in collaborating to provide leadership and management skills to students of SUSLA who are interested in the Reserve Officers Training Corp (ROTC).

SUSLA and GSU enter into this MOU in the spirit of cooperation and mutual recognition of each other as institutions of higher learning offering quality education to its constituents. Each institution is dedicated to serving a diversity of students from all walks of life, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sex, disability, color, age, marital status, national origin or other non-merit factors.

Purpose

It is the purpose of this MOU to enable the students of SUSLA to engage in a curriculum that will develop the foundational values, attributes and skills required in Military Science. Additionally, students may be incentivized to continue their studies beyond the associate level and into the baccalaureate level at GSU. The agreement establishes a curriculum through which SUSLA students can matriculate under the tutelage of faculty members from the Military Science Department of GSU.

Elements of Collaboration

During the period of this agreement, SUSLA will:

- Register students interested in Military Science to follow the following outline of study:

- Provide the necessary facilities, to include classroom and office space.


During the period of this agreement, GSU will:

- Provide the faculty needed to facilitate courses in Military Science.
- Provide Army Scholarships that will pay for tuition and a book allowance of \$600 per semester.
- Provide uniforms for students matriculating in the Military Science curriculum.

Longevity of the Agreement

This MOU is perpetual until it is discontinued by either educational partner by submitting written notification to the other partner one year prior to the identified cancellation date in order to protect all students involved.


