The Southern University Baton Rouge Campus 2011-2012 proposed operating budget reflects a decline in state funding. To assist in offsetting the anticipated loss of state funding, the University is requesting permission to increase tuition by 5% in accordance with revised statue 17:3351(A)(5)(e) and an additional 5% based on the approved LA GRAD Act. These two adjustments will increase full-time tuition and fees approximately \$235 per semester for undergraduate students and \$277 per semester for graduate students.

The LA GRAD Act also requires the University to establish a schedule for increasing nonresident tuition amounts to levels that are not less than the average tuition charged to Louisiana residents attending peer public Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU's), in the SREB member states by category. Therefore, in order to comply with the LA GRAD Act, we are requesting permission to increase nonresident fees by \$373 per semester for undergraduate students and \$370 per semester graduate students.

Your approval of these increases and the approval of the Southern University Board of Supervisors would be greatly appreciated.

SUBJECT: Proposed New Meal Plan and Food Service Contract Amendment Sodexo Foods, Inc

In a recent on-line vote conducted from April 18<sup>th</sup> thru May 2, 2011 (<u>www.suno.edu</u>), the SUNO students voted to approve a revised meal plan for the campus (57.35% Yes / 42.65% No).

The major components to the revised plan:

• All STUDENTS residing in University Housing will be required to purchase a \$600.00 <u>declining balance</u>\* meal plan each semester. This is a reduction from the current plan of \$1,600.00.

• All first time students not residing in the University housing would be required to purchase a \$100.00 declining balance meal plan each semester.

• All remaining students would be required to purchase a \$50.00 <u>declining balance</u> meal plan each semester.

• The Knights Dining Hall would be open Monday through Friday.

• Students will be able to use the meal plan card at the Grab-N-Go location during the day and evening class hours.

\*Declining Balance Plan—Unlike the current plan in which dollars are lost if not used for the days and weeks designated, declining balance funds can be used at anytime during the semester purchased.

#### AMENDMENT

#### SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY AT NEW ORLEANS

#### AND

#### SODEXO OPERATIONS, LLC

THIS AMENDMENT, dated June 8, 2011, is between SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY AT NEW ORLEANS ("SUNO") and SODEXO OPERATIONS, LLC ("Sodexo").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SUNO and Sodexo entered into a certain Management Agreement for Food Services dated September 30, 2009, ("Agreement"), whereby Sodexo manages and operates SUNO's Food Service operation at 6400 Press Drive, New Orleans, Louisiana 70126;

WHEREAS, the parties now desire to amend the aforesaid Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Section 4.5 is deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

#### "4.5 Declining Balance Meal Plans.

A. Sodexo shall offer the following Declining Balance Meal Plans to dining patrons for the 2011-2012 academic year:

All resident students shall be required to purchase a minimum of \$600 Declining Balance meal plan points per semester.

All first time students not living in the residence halls shall be required to purchase a minimum of \$100 Declining Balance meal plan points per semester.

Returning non-resident students shall be required to purchase a minimum of \$50.00) in Declining Balance meal plan points.

B. Client shall sell Declining Balance Plans to students. Sodexo shall invoice Client weekly for all Declining Balance points redeemed. Unused Declining Balance dollars shall expire at the end of each semester and shall be for Sodexo's account.

Buy in amounts shall be reviewed by Client and Sodexo annually. The main cafeteria shall be a la carte pricing. Cafeteria shall be open Monday – Friday, closed on weekends. Hours of operation shall be mutually agreed upon each semester."

2. Section 7.6 is deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

"7.6 <u>Investment</u>. On or about September 2010, Sodexo provided an amount equal to Thirty Eight Thousand Dollars (\$38,000) ("Investment") to be used toward the 'Grab-N-Go' retail location. Sodexo shall continue to amortize the Investment on a straight-line basis over two (2) years, which amortization commenced September 1, 2010. Such amortization shall continue to be charged as an operating expense of the Food Service operation. Sodexo shall own the Investment."

3. Section 8.5 is added as follows:

"8.5 <u>Adjustments</u>. The Financial Arrangement will be adjusted to reflect additional costs incurred by Sodexo (i) in connection with the implementation of legislation or other legal requirements, including, but not limited to, the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, which comprise the health care reform of 2010, or other health care rules and regulations, or any modifications thereto or (ii) increases in benefit costs paid by Sodexo on behalf of covered employees. The adjustment to the Financial Arrangement will be effective from the date the events of (i) and/or (ii) occur."

4. This Amendment is effective August 1, 2011 and thereafter, unless amended. All other terms and conditions contained in the Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect, except by necessary implication.
